Re: 2014 economic adjustment for non-union employees

As per previous Board resolutions below, which were also reviewed at the November 20, 2013 meeting, the economic adjustment that will be accorded to non-union Library employees as of January 1, 2014 is 1.4%.

The following motion is recommended:

THAT the Library Board receive the report on the 2014 economic adjustment for non-union staff.

RESOLUTION L-03-03

BE IT RESOLVED and it is hereby resolved by the Newmarket Public Library Board as follows:

1. THAT Resolution L-01-02 number 3. Is amended as at October 15, 2003 to be applied to the 2004 Budget as follows:

THAT an economic increase shall be applied annually to the established salary grid for non-union salaries, based on a year over year comparison as published in the Consumer Price Index for Toronto, Ontario as at September 30th of the previous year. This increase shall be effective January 1st and generally the salaries of all employees will increase by the percentage applied to their existing grid position. Employees whose performances clearly fall short of the performance expectations will not increase with their ranges, subject to the CEO's approval.

DATED EFFECTIVE the 17th day of September, 2003.

BE IT RESOLVED and it is hereby resolved by the Newmarket Public Library Board as follows:

- 1. THAT the Newmarket Public Library shall conduct an annual assessment by May 1st of the budget year on economic/annual adjustments provided by the 9 comparator municipal libraries' utilized in the market value assessment. The salaries/wages of non-union staff shall be automatically adjusted retroactive to January 1st based upon the average adjustment by the 9 comparator libraries less any adjustment previously made by Newmarket Public Library for that year.
- 2. AND THAT the adjustment shall be subject to the C.E.O. determining if there is an outlier figure(s) that should be discarded from the calculation; (an outlier figure is one that differs greatly from the others, whether high or low).
- 3. AND THAT those employees whose performance clearly falls short of the performance expectations will not increase with their ranges, subject to the C.E.O.'s approval.

Re: Social media policies

At a recent workshop on social media and workplace issues, it was presented that employees' personal social media content is now often recognized by courts as public comment, such that if comment was to be deemed damaging to the employer's reputation or ability to carry out its business, it may be subject to disciplinary action.

However, the library's Social Media Policy and Public Relations Policy are both silent on this, instead indicating that if an employee is, or may reasonably be, identified as an employee of the Library, they need only place a disclaimer on their social media account indicating that opinions are their own. The workshop suggested that the policy indicate that notwithstanding such a disclaimer, the employer reserves the right to take disciplinary action under strict conditions under which commentary on social media might constitute misconduct.

In addition, it was recommended that a policy should also indicate the disposition of social media accounts used by employees as official representatives of the Library, should they leave the Library's employ.

The following motion is recommended:

THAT the Library Board instruct the CEO to revise the Social Media Policy and Public Relations Policy to address the topics presented, and to bring a draft policy to a future Board meeting.

Re: Overdue fines for seniors

According to the Membership Policy approved by the Board December 19, 2012, senior citizens are exempt from paying overdue fines, although replacement charges and processing fees still apply. According to the Inter-Library Loan Policy approved by the Board May 20, 2009, the fines charged for items from other public libraries is \$1.00 per day. This was initially interpreted to mean that seniors were *not* exempt from inter-library fines. When the Library changed its management computer system in 2010, it was programmed to exempt seniors from inter-library fines to best reflect policy.

Recent incidents have suggested that some senior library patrons have not been sufficiently encouraged to return inter-library loan items by the due date. Late returns of inter-library loans cause difficulty for staff who must deal with the owning library, who often charge NPL a fine. A survey of similar-sized libraries was taken and none exempt seniors in this way; a very small proportion still exempt seniors from regular fines.

It is therefore proposed that the Membership Policy be revised to indicate that inter-library loan fines apply equally to seniors. If the Board wishes they may also ask staff to report back on options to phase out other fines exemptions for seniors.

The following motion is recommended:

THAT the Library Board approve a revised Membership Policy indicating that seniors (aged 65 and over) are subject to the same overdue fines for inter-library loan items as all other library patrons.
