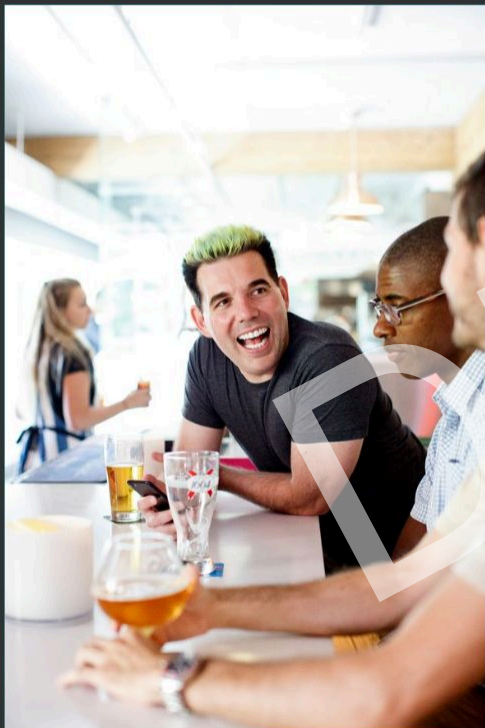

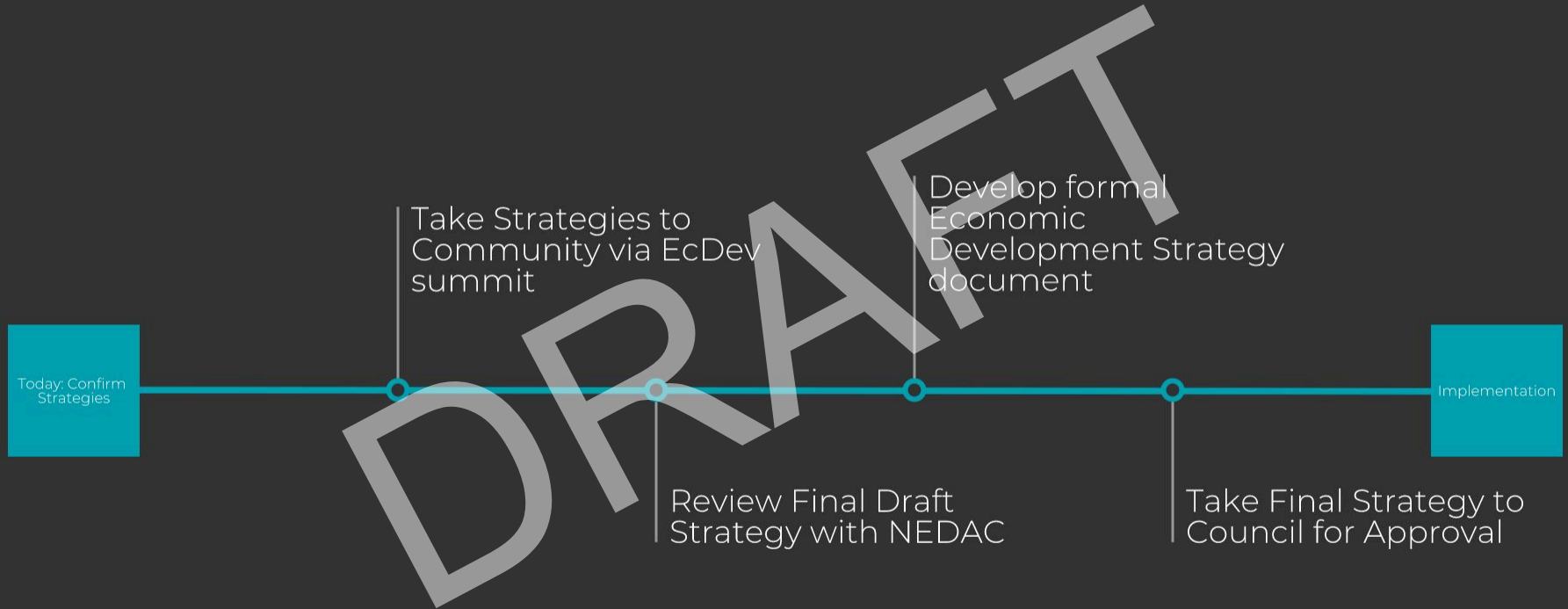

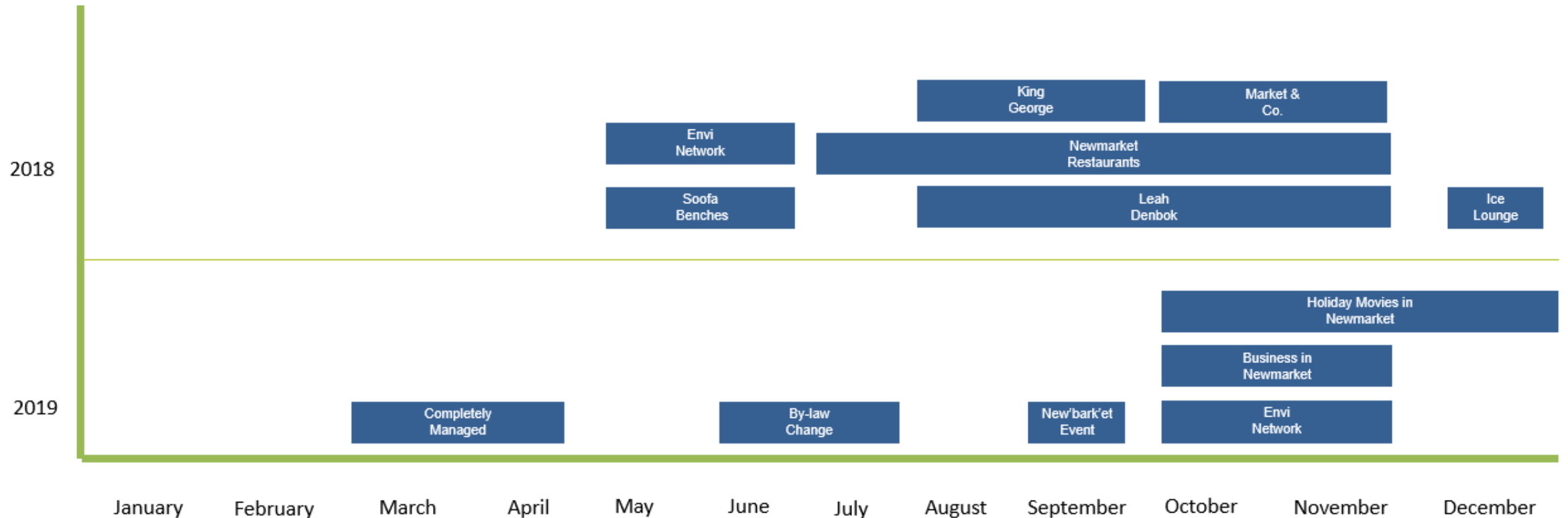

Newmarket bylaw change makes large-scale development easier through “plug and play” mindset

The **Town of Newmarket** has voted in favour of updating its bylaws to align better with its secondary plan and foster further development along the Yonge and Davis corridors.

The new zoning bylaw, approved on June 10, makes changes to permitted land uses, building heights, and densities, among other things, by “zoning in” about 20 million square feet of mixed use space over an expanse of about 200 acres.

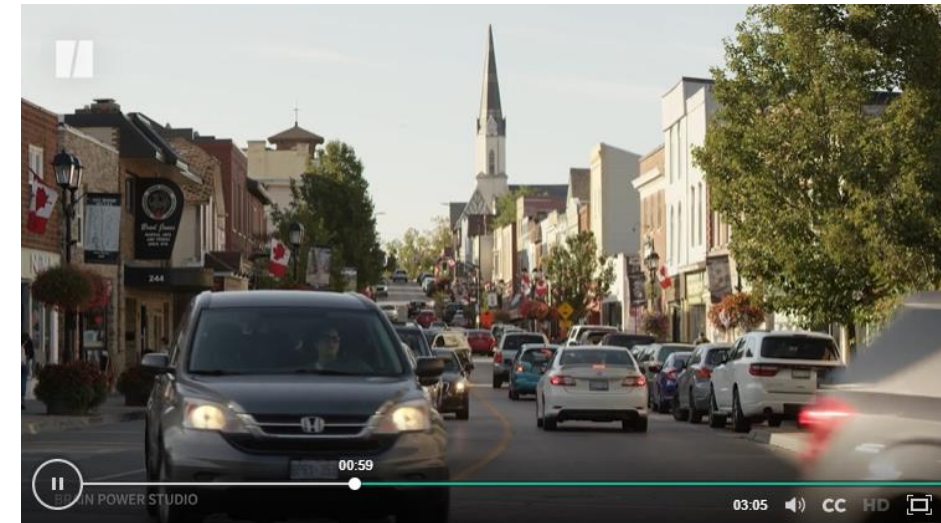

### Getting there

Newmarket is a convenient trip from Toronto via the 404. On a good day, you can expect to get into town in 45 minutes. Budget a full day to take in Newmarket's surrounding park networks in between nothing. Biking through the Wesley Brooks Conservation Area or Bailey Ecological Park is highly recommended. 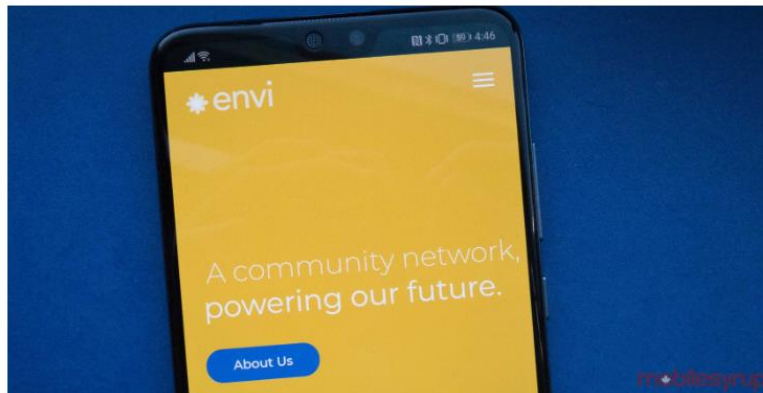

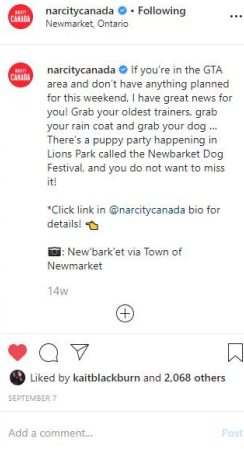

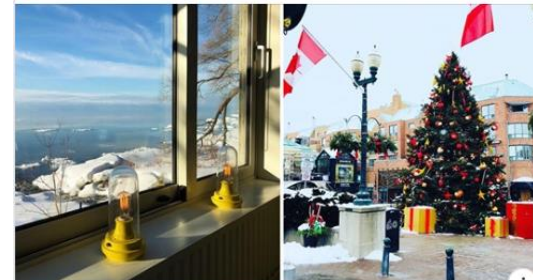
