## Mandate

The Accessibility Advisory Committee encourages and facilitates accessibility for all persons with disabilities in the Town of Newmarket by:

- Providing advice, recommendations and assistance to Council to develop and facilitate strategies for the identification and elimination of barriers for citizens with disabilities.
- Promoting accessibility related public outreach, education and awareness initiatives.



Our committee consulted, reviewed plans and provided recommendations for these initiatives and projects:

 Consulted with external partners and provided assistance with the Upper Canada Mall universal accessible washroom renovations.





- Mulock Property, Stickwood Walker Farmhouse, Patterson Sidewalk renovations, Northwest Quadrant Trail System Design Concepts, Skateboard Park, Electric Vehicle Parking,
- Conducted an audit of the entrances and sidewalks to storefronts on Main Street, with a goal to make Main Street accessible for all.
- We made recommendations to staff to include Accessibility to the Financial Incentive Program to help fund accessible renovations to Main St.
- Reviewed Site Plan applications and provided recommendations on accessibility related conditions to staff.
- Participated in the annual National Access Ability Week Celebrations virtually through recorded interviews and videos.



- Provided recommendations for the downtown parking analysis and reviewed planned short-term, medium-term and long-term options.
- Continually reviewed Federal and Provincial grant opportunities related to accessible projects.
- Worked with businesses in the Town of Newmarket to increase accessibility at the entrances and exists to stores.
- Reviewed plans to use the Mobi Mats for outdoor Town-led events to increase accessibility.
- Provided recommendations regarding accessible van parking signage surrounding Riverwalk Commons and Fairy Lake.
- Van Accessible Signage has now been installed at 4 extra wide accessible parking spots making them AODA compliant.



- Provided advice on the Town of Newmarket's annual Accessibility Plan update.
- Provided ongoing public awareness of accessibility.
- Endorsed the use of touchless door operators on future Town of Newmarket facilities, and during renovation of existing facilities.



#### To make Main Street more accessible

- We will be making a presentation to Main Street BIA on the importance and advantages to making their businesses accessible.
- We are working with town staff to add Accessibility to the Financial Incentive Program to help offset the costs.
- We will be working towards taking advantage of high school community volunteering hours to help with the work on making Main St. accessible.

#### **Fairy Lake Accessible Washrooms**

 Town staff is investigating funding grants to fund making the washrooms at Fairy Lake Universally Accessible. This means including an adult change table and ceiling lift system.



#### **Mulock Property**

 We are working with staff to ensure this new park is accessible to everyone.

#### **Accessible Door to Door Taxi service for Newmarket**

 Our committee is looking at ways to encourage local taxi service companies to offer accessible door to door service at the same rate. (maybe Allen can add to this)

#### **Annual National Access Ability Week**

 Working with town staff to coordinate this years National Access Ability Week awareness activities.



#### Site Plan Review

 We continue to review all site plan applications to ensure AODA compliance.

#### **Parking**

 We continue to identify other parking within the Town that is accessible van friendly.


#### **Elections**

## Mandate

The Anti-Black Racism Task Force supports the Town's work and encourages positive race relations within the Town of Newmarket by providing advice to Council/the Strategic Leadership Team and being mindful of its focus on anti-Black racism and racial equity within Newmarket by:

 Making recommendations to Council that focus on racial equity opportunities in Newmarket, and on issues or activities that impact the Black community.



- Developed and distributed first community-wide survey on anti-Black racism (367 responses)
- Designed and conducted 14 interviews with local Black community members
- Built a reservoir of resources (100+ videos and 50+ articles/reports)
- Established cross-municipal collaboration with Toronto's Confronting Anti-Black Racism Unit
- Developed a connection with Neighbourhood Network
- Delivered Interim Report to Council on May 25, 2021

## **Events**

- Committee is considering a Town Hall to hold space for community to engage in open dialogue on lived experiences etc.
- Consideration of an informal gathering to bring community & new families together (post-Pandemic)
- Future partnerships with the Town of Bradford and Town of East Gwillimbury on a flag raising for the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (March 21)



- Working towards a final report to Council with actionable recommendations based on reviewing and analyzing the following:
  - Survey and interview data
  - Best practice from other municipalities
  - Literature on anti-Black racism and the Black experience in York Region and Canada
  - 2016 Census demographic information for the Town of Newmarket

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENT AUDIT

- Reviewed scope of audit prior to audit starting 2018, 2019 and 2020 f/s
- Post-audit, pre-issuance review of financial statements including recommendations related to accounting and disclosures – 2018 and 2019 f/s
- Focussed on management and auditor processes affected by the pandemic
   2019 f/s
- Recommended Council approve financial statements for 2018 and 2019
- Ensured management and auditor agreement on extra time requirements and cost overruns – 2018 f/s
- Discussed preparedness for upcoming changes to accounting standards –
   Asset Retirement Obligations may require significant work 2023 f/s



#### FINANCIAL PROCESSES AND CONTROLS

- Discussed with Internal Auditors their identification of High Risk Areas that they would be reviewing
- Conducted in camera sessions with the external auditor
- Facilitated a process for ongoing communication between the auditors and the CAO

### Mandate

The Elman W. Campbell Museum Board is responsible for advising on the development of policies and programs for the operation of the Elman W. Campbell Museum at 134 Main Street South.



## Impact of Covid-19

The Museum closed between January and beginning of February 2020 for maintenance work.

New laminate tile flooring installed to replace old carpets. All walls painted white, ceilings painted white to highlight our barrel vaulted ceilings and new light fixtures installed. Mould on west wall was remedied and replaced with drywall.

The Museum closed on March 12, 2020 due to COVID-19 pandemic. No re-opening date has been announced.

Museum Staff have been diligent in supporting the Community and the Town during this pandemic and redeployed to help with other Town initiatives.

Facilities staff are responsible for overseeing museum during the closure.





- 4. Public awareness and engagement activities.




