As a taxpayer at 28 Hamilton Drive for over half a century, we find it difficult to comprehend how drastically our quality of life could change should this project proceed. It makes one wonder if being a good, honest citizen of Newmarket and willing volunteer since 1944 was really worth it, considering what we presently are facing. Fact 1

A willing volunteer with York Regional Police for over 25 years (YRP #7913) annually contributing 300 to 500 hrs per year, volunteering my time, and in some instance my personal financial resources, generating positive relations on behalf of YRP across Ontario, as far east as Newfoundland and overseas in Ireland and England,

Fact 2:
